Young couples: A prioritized Thrust

he worst kind of poverty', it is said, 'is that of isolation'. Marriage gifts one with companionship. Most of the Young Couples live in heaven, experiencing the exhilarations of human love, giving and accepting, knowing deeply each other, playing the tunes for the other, so on and so forth. The old couples generally cherish this period to be best in their whole married life. At the same time, we cannot forget a negligible number of unfortunate young couples, going through distressing experiences.

The young family is the cradle of faith formation. It is said, as the family, so the Church. Our faith has been handed down to us from generation to generation through families. By being an integral part of the community that endeavours to keep burning coals of faith aglow, the young couples need to keep intact the faith and values alive through children. Parents, by their word and example, need to be the first preachers of the faith to their children. Along with that, they may also contribute willingly in terms of their youthful energy, skills, knowledge in technology, networking ability, planning and managerial skills coupled with compassion. Pope Francis says, "I have a dogmatic certainty, God is in every person's life. Even if the life of a person has been a disaster, even if it is destroyed by vices, drugs or anything else -God is in that person's life". Anchored in the wisdom and faith, young couples will undoubtedly be the channels of grace in families, society, the church and the nation at large.

'Young couples' has been prioritized as one of the most important thrusts for the future of the Eparchy of Kalyan. A comprehensive study about it is in progress. We have to find more inclusive ways by which we can help the young couples to meet today's expectations helping them in merging their daily life with the larger evangelizing role given to them by our Master.

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Managing the first years of

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o become an engineer one studies for four years, to become a doctor one studies for five years. To become a catholic priest one prepares for more than 12 years. There is no other profession for which one prepares for more time, than to become a catholic priest. Today the profession for which one needs absolutely no qualification and preparation is to become a husband, a wife. It is ironical that to become a priest, a 'Father' in the Catholic Church one prepares for the longest time ever but to become the father of a child, one needs no qualification!

Until the previous generation, we all lived in joint families which in turn was part of a close-knit society. In this societal arrangement, the inadequacies of an ill equipped young husband and wife were easily taken care of. But in today's nuclear families, the husband and wife are all alone to deal with each other's inadequacies and the conflicts that arise from those inadequacies. The loneliness of the modern cities adds to the problem. No wonder, many young couples are finding it difficult to perform their duties as a good husband and a good wife. The fault lines are showing. The rising divorce rates is a clear indication of this deeper problem.

Majority of the divorces happen in the first four

years of the marriage. It is during the first four years of marriage that the inadequate preparation with which one has entered the married life gets most exposed. The solace is that if a couple can get through the difficulties and tribulations of the first four years of their marriage, their marriage has a very high chance of being successful. What are the major problems a couple faces in the first four years of their marriage?

Life after honeymoon

The day of the marriage, the initial weeks and months of a marriage do give a physical and emotional high to most. The couple's brain releases high quantities of love hormones, dopamine, serotonin, oxytocin etc at this point of time. The biological reality is that when the couple start living together for the first time, the levels of these love hormones will rise, it will peak after few weeks and ultimately will come down to normal levels after few months. For couples who got married after a long period of time of courtship, this biological phase will get over much faster. It is at the end of this biological phase that when one starts hearing statements like, 'you have changed so much', 'you weren't like this before' in the lives of an young couple. Young couples should realise that this peaking of love hormones and its coming back to normal levels are not a sign of marriage going sour. But instead it is time for the physical intimacy stage in the married life to shift towards a more stable and long lasting emotional intimacy between a man and a women.

But for some couples lack of proper knowledge about sexual matters could create problems even in developing proper physical intimacy between them.

Two individuals under one roof

No two individuals are alike. Every individual has his likes and dislikes. So it is natural that when two individuals start living under one roof for the first time, differences will occur. The man who has an early-to-bed, early-to-rise habit might marry a woman who has a late-to-get-up, late-to-sleep habit. Couples should understand that it is extremely difficult to change a habit one has developed over a long period of time. For couples who got married after long courtship, the differences might come as a total surprise. Individuals put on their best behaviour during their courtship period. But all their inherent differences come out in the open once they start living under one roof. Couples should realise that living with someone day in and out have its moments of insanity. So what really matters is not that differences exist between a husband and a wife but how they resolve those differences.

Life after the birth of a baby

Research shows that most dangerous time in the relationship of a young couple is around the time of a first baby. Pregnancy and childbirth brings its own set of changes in a woman's body. She is psychologically upset about the extra kilos and the stretch marks pregnancy has gifted her. The young wife starts thinking that she is no more as beautiful as she was before. She is worried that her husband might not like her as much as before. In addition to her psychological worries, the topsy-turvy sleep patterns, extra work load that comes along with the arrival of the baby etc physically tires her. Post natal depression is widely prevalent among first-time mothers. The husband starts thinking that the wife cares only for the child and is neglecting his needs. All these issues have large impact on the relationship between a husband and a wife.

Every problem has a solution

Every problem has a solution, provided one is willing to search for it. The first step in looking for a solution, is accepting the existence of the problem. No relationship between two individuals can exist without problems. So when problems crop up, do not try to ignore it. Do accept its existence. Start looking for solutions.

Most problems between young couples get sorted out if there is proper communication between couples. Couples should devote, even if

both are working, at least 30 minutes everyday to communicate with each other. It is the time when the television sets and cooking stoves are off. It is the time when the young couples are doing nothing, but chatting about what happened on that day, more so the good things that happened on that day, however small they are. Couples should use this time to discuss about their dreams of the future and how they plan to achieve it.

Husband should find enough opportunities to reassure his young wife that despite those extra kilos, he loves her more than ever. It is these moments of communication that help a young couple to make that important transition from a mostly physical relationship that existed in the early days of a marriage to a strong emotional bond between a man and a woman. The physicality of the relationship is important. But it is the strength of this emotional bond that ultimately determines whether these two individuals will live together happily for ever. The quality communication time coupled with few minutes of family prayer everyday will help strengthen this emotional bond and help sort out most of the problems in the lives of a young couple.

At times, problems can arise that are beyond the capability of a young couple to solve. Don't feel disheartened. Don't feel bad about seeking outside help. Seek the help of your elders, church authorities to solve your problems. Many a problem can be sorted out, if young couples seek help before they become full-blown problems. At times there are problems that need professional help. Many problems including sexual problems can easily be sorted out by going in for professional advise at the right time.

Whether it is a crop in the field or a child at home, its future depends on the quality of care it receives in the initial days of its life. So is it with marriage. Take care of it very well in its initial years for a strong, life-long married life.

Coupled together -Couples forever

Never before has proclaiming the Gospel on the Family in social and spiritual crisis been more urgent and necessary. - Pope Francis



***** From today until death, in good times and bad..." these days couples comfortably forget this solemn vow taken on their day of marriage in front of Christ and His Church. Over the years, the traditional beliefs on marriage have fallen. Divorce is at its peak and those who are surviving in this bond of marriage just co-exist without true love. Is there a way out?

A Real Need

Pope Francis has announced that in October 2014 an Extraordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops will take place in the Vatican to discuss the theme: 'The pastoral challenges for the family in the context of evangelisation'. In order to prepare for this Synod, and to assist in its discussions, the Secretariat of the Synod of Bishops has provided a preparatory document to initiate discussions and to obtain the feelings and opinions of the faithful. The preparatory document includes some questions but three of them need immediate attention in the context of Kalyan diocese. These three questions are:

- 1. What pastoral care has the Church provided in supporting couples in formation and in crisis situations?
- 2. What specific contribution can couples and families make to spread a credible and holistic idea of the couple and the Christian family today?
- 3. How successful have you been in proposing a manner of praying within the family which can withstand life's complexities and today's culture?

The Pope is courageously taking up an issue, untouched for decades, that is rampant in the Church. I believe that the popularity of the Pope will be tested tremendously with the advent of this final document. Nevertheless, he has the courage to take it up.

A session for young couples, married for not more than five years, was organized by the family apostolate at Little Flower Church, Nerul. In fact, it triggered the young couples - movement in the diocese of Kalyan. During the session, the couples were asked to articulate their five years of marriage in two words. The couples had many adjectives to share, but the speaker dealt with two words -"compatibility" and "compromise". If there is compatibility among partners then they sail smoothly, if not, then one needs to live a life of compromises. The session, though enlightening, ended with the delegates asking for more such seminars and an official forum in the parish/diocese where young couples can meet at regular intervals in a more organized manner-A need and demand from the couples themselves!

Thus, there is a felt need at the grassroots, among young couples, as well as within the hierarchy of the Church that this issue needs to be addressed immediately. This article aims to reflect the need for young couples - movement by putting on paper some common marriage problems young couples face.

Communication Problems

Communication is never a problem when everything is fine all around, but life is not always fun. It is very common for two people who are madly in love, to one day hate each other or fight the very next day. Does it feel like you and your partner can never talk about something without fighting, and that you go round and round in circles without solving any problem? Thus silly fights or conflicts are a natural phenomenon in any married couple's life and a very common pattern that most couples fall into at some point or another. At times like these, women unknowingly tend to blame men and make them feel guilty for their actions. On the other hand, when men become upset, they tend to become judgmental of women and women's feelings and sound mean and uncaring. This points to the fact that communication is a complex process, that

encompasses more than just the words you say. You tend to communicate using the default pattern that you learned in your family of origin.

Couples should know that during times of conflict talking does not always work. Instead of verbally sharing your feelings with your partner, write to him or her through sms, email or even a letter. According to experts, writing allows you to listen to your feelings without worrying about hurting your partner. By freely expressing and listening to your own feelings, you automatically become more aware and loving. As men write, they become more caring, understanding and respectful; as women write, they become more trusting, accepting and appreciative. If you are lazy and not comfortable writing down your feelings, you may also choose to do the same process in your mind. Simply refrain from talking and review what happened in your mind. By carrying on an inner dialogue, expressing the complete truth about your feelings, you will suddenly become free from their negative clutch and positive feelings will resurface.

It may seem that I ended up giving a solution! NO. It only shows that before you can communicate your thoughts, feelings, needs and desires to your spouse, you need to become more

self-aware. These are the skills you need to develop. Reading books, attending workshops and getting guidance from experts are few ways to learn such healthy skills. Or this learning can even happen in a group of young couples, similar to you and and facing the same problems, where coming together can be really encouraging as well as fun.

Finance Management

It is no secret that one of the top sources of contention among couples today is money. There are couples where the husband does not even know the salary of his wife and what she does with her money! Monetary differences are common problems in marriage. Things tend to get a little complicated as both partners work and get used to a certain amount of financial independence. Things like secret accounts and undiscussed purchases can create a breach of trust in a relationship, that is difficult to come back from. In the case of many successful marriages both of them are always aware of and have access to all of their funds. A number of suggestions to couples facing this problem run into my mind, like; don't be secretive, set a budget together, decide together on how to set up accounts, discuss your priorities and expectations and don't forget to plan for the future. A group of young couples who regularly meet in the parish can also get together and call an exemplary senior couple from the community to share their experience on compatibility, especially in the realm of finance.

Marriage comes with many struggles and I have just touched upon the tip of the ice-berg with two basic problems, but there are many problems which need attention. Problems like parent traps, parenting styles or child rearing, sexual differences, in-law issues, division of household work, etc. If you are couples struggling in one or many of the areas listed, experts say, consider taking a class, reading a book, or getting counseling to help you learn the skills to thrive in your marriage.

A Proposed Answer

In this world, for every profession or job we take up there is a period of formation or even prior training provided. Surprisingly it is only in the institution of marriage that one gets admitted into without any training or exams. Perhaps, for marriage we don't need prior formation but rather an ongoing formation. This essay is just to motivate young couples to come together as one group in your parishes; for many couples feel that it is the time to concentrate on ones career, children and having fun. Church can always take a back stage and come in at a later phase of life. But in today's social and spiritual crisis, you need many more hands to help. Thus hands of young couples like you, sailing in the same boat, can really be a great support, help and life saving guide when you need the most. I strongly believe that organizing young couples groups and meeting at regular intervals in the parish/diocese will be the best form of pastoral care in supporting couples in formation and couples in crisis situations.

Young Couples and Difficulties & Challenges in Marriages

The scope of this paper is to evaluate and to identify the difficulties and challenges the young couples face in their married life. As specified in the Canon Law, by marriage a man and a woman enter into a contract giving their personal consent to live together as partners for their whole life. This contract is for a life of love, caring, understanding, communion, fellowship, giving, taking, sacrifice, etc. The model of Christian marriage as per St. Paul is the way Jesus loved the Church: a total self-giving even at the cost of sacrificing one's ownlife (Eph 5: 25).

Various Possibilities of Marriages in the Catholic Migrant Context

In this changed times, one may be surprised to see different types of marriages among the migrants in mega cities such as arranged marriages, love marriages, civil marriage between two free persons, civil marriage between one divorcee and the other free, marriage between two divorcees, marriage into other religion, marriage of convenience, living together of free or divorced, etc. From among the total number of marriages more than 65% of them are arranged marriages between two Syro-Malabar Catholics. The remaining are arranged marriages or love marriages persons of other Catholic or non-Catholic Churches and about 10% with non-Christians.

Some Experiences

Family issues related to love marriages are on the rise nowadays.

1. Some love marriages between Catholics and non-



Christians are contracted with the provision of the disparity of cult. But when they start living together, the faith matters a lot for each one. The disparity leads to conflicts especially when there are children.

2. The parents insist that a Catholic should get married only to another Catholic especially when they come to know about the religiosity of the other party. This situation forces the Catholic party to heed the plea of the parents and finally give consent to marry a Catholic. Unfortunately in some cases, they secretly continue the relationship with the person in love. This obviously leads to the break of marriage.

3. Undue interference of the parents in the family life and decision making of the children leads to the break of marriage. Over possessiveness of the parents is found to be another reason. 4. Spending time together during the marriage preparation course also benefits positively as they come to know each other in a deeper way. Sometimes they realize their incompatibility and they decide to cancel the marriage. Cancelling the marriages after fixing it or even after engagement is on the increase.

5. The Church insists that a person must have sufficiently developed faculties of intellect and will, to be able to judge and to will a truly human act. Marriage involves decision making. Discretion of judgement refers to the capacity of intellect and will to specifically evaluate, decide and freely enter marriage. Intellectual maturity is the most basic level expected in the adults who make a commitment for whole life. But unfortunately in some adults this reasoning is overpowered by only emotions. Still worse situations occur when this reasoning is done by some other minds like parents, or other kith and kin.

Difficulties and Challenges:

1. In the decision making process, who takes the final decision for the new family: the young couples or their parents? A decision forced on by the parents is undesirable. At the same time, many feel insecure about the decisions taken by the young couples alone as it lacks perfection. I would say, a perfect decision making should be a process where the young couples take the final decision with the constant consultation with the parents who would help them to evaluate and decide. A decision made by the parents against the will of the young couples is unjustified.

2. I see serious dangers when the youngsters got married only because they were in love. The only reason for their marriage was 'in love'. The other key factors for a successful married life were not taken into serious consideration. Love need not be the only component that sustains a whole life together but rather is one of the many important components. What is necessary is that one loves the partner whom one marries.

3. Nowadays, one of the major problems of the young couples is having different faiths as a result of the Disparity of cult marriage. I analyse this problem as one where our youngsters do not have the

conviction that the person whom they marry should also have the same faith. If our youngsters consider disparity of cult marriages as the fashion of the day, living our faith as one family will be almost impossible and it will result in the disintegration of the family thus the stability of the community will be at stake.

4. Conversion of heart only should lead to conversion to another religion. I fear sometimes that some non-Christians, get converted only for the sake of getting married. In these cases usually there is no living of faith in the families. The children, even if they are baptized, they are not given opportunities of family prayers, Sunday obligations, nor they are sent for catechism classes. In some cases, once the marriage is failed, even if they are converted Catholics, they just go back to their original religion and do not care for collaborating for anything further as per the laws of the Church.

5. Among the migrant families, the most of the cases the families are very small. They suffer from the lack of family bond and hence lack of strength. Hence the parents totally depend on their children for their future. Many parents especially mothers suffer from the insecurity feeling and hence show total dependence on their male children. This leads to undue interference in their family life. This phenomenon affects the growth of the newly wedded couple. There are complaints of the friction between the mother-in-law and daughter-in-law which also leads to separated life of the spouses.

6. One or two children in the family sometimes prevent the holistic development of the children. They get all they want and need not share with anyone else. This leads to selfishness and egoism. It is surprising to see the young families resist in sharing including their salaries together. These are against the basic concept of family values of giving and sacrificing.

7. The parents at that time of migration in order to get foot hold in these cities had to undergo lots of hardships. And they made sure that their children do not face the same difficulties. Many elderly parents do not share their problems with their children but they suffer in private. And some others do not include their children in the decision making process. The parents take care of each and every need of the family and of the children. Hence most of the children lack practical knowledge and experience even to do small or big house-hold activities. When their children get married and found new families, they do not know to take decisions, to handle many situations and do house-hold activities.

8. The young families undoubtedly need follow up programme after their marriage and looking at the current development it goes without saying. The strain and stress of the job situations, increased financial burdens and loans, lack of other family members for offering a helping hand, etc. contribute tremendously to the pressure of the young families and they are not able to cope with the rigorous schedule of family life. These situations force them to neglect their prayer life and Sunday obligations etc.

9. For the growth in faith, the small children need models and witnesses. In the Syro-Malabar Church tradition, the grand-parents were also god-parents at the time of baptism of their grand-children and they took initiatives for traditionally handing over the faith to their grand-children. They were either living together or close by and it was possible. Now among the migrant families, also because of lack of space in small flats or houses, most of the young families live separately from their parents and have no much chance to hand over the faith to their newly born grand children. This will definitely affect the future in practicing of the faith of the young families.

10. Career oriented women become independent in the families. They earn good salaries, sometimes more than men. These situations create problems such as inferiority complex of men, lack of time and interests for the women in the family affairs, considering rearing children a burden, no qualitative and quantitative interaction with the extended family members etc. The females demands equality with the males to enjoy certain freedom.

11. The young families need lot of follow up by the pastoral team in the parishes. Frequent enquiry about the well-being of the families, making sure of their presence together for the ecclesial activities, informal talks about the life adjustments of the young families, invitation for counselling when problems are observed, etc. should be under the permanent vigilance of the pastoral team.

12. Family counselling cell and reconciliation forums are the need of the hour to help.

13. Some Practising Catholics do not have the wedlock. It is a challenge to our community and for its stability. Wedlock becomes a reason for anonymity for some migrants when they have contracted some irregular marriages.

14. Alcoholism, tv/internet/mobile addictions, funpicnic loving nature, free movement with friends, relativism, consumerism, the onslaught of globalization, nuclear family culture, imitation of the western culture, development of technology and the resultant misuse of it, workaholism, wreaked havoc in the life and faith life are the other dangers affecting the married life.

CONCLUSION

The Syro-Malabar church has a very rich tradition and patrimony which our forefathers treasured, preserved and handed down through centuries along with unwavering faith. By upholding sanctity of marriage, fidelity in marriage, maintaining family ties and reputation they carried forward this legacy. The young couples need to cherish these traditions and give due worth for the spiritual customs and life. Though it might seem difficult, the pastors of the Church with the collaboration of all need to address the issues related to the young couples and to safe guard the faith of the individuals, families and the community.

Greeting of Peace

Mar Thomas Elevanal Bishop of Kalyan Diocese

Before the reading from the Gospel, the Priest gives the greeting of peace to the people with the Gospel. It signifies that the Gospel contains the words and message of peace. It reminds us that the priest is about to read the good news of the peace of Christ.

Peace be with you

Whenever the Risen Lord appeared to the apostles He greeted them peace (Lk. 24:36; Jn. 20:19, 26). As a result of the sin of our first parents they lost the God given gift of peace. Jesus through His cross reconciled us to God and restored us peace. This peace is the fruit of the birth, passion, death and resurrection of Christ. We see the apostles through their writings, wishing this peace to their communities (Rom. 1:7; 1 Pet. 1:2; 2 Jn. 3; Jude. 2) St. Paul reminds us that Jesus himself is the peace (Ep. 2:14). 'Peace be with you' means that the Risen Christ be with you. There is the presence of Christ among the community gathered together in His name. The same Christ is going to speak to the community through the Gospel.

Greeting in the form of the Cross

Jesus promised His peace to His disciples (Jn. 14:27). It is through His Cross that He gained for us reconciliation and peace. St. Paul reminds us thus making peace, He reconciled us to God by means of the Cross (Ep. 2:16). That is why the Priest gives the greeting of peace in the form of the Cross. At this time the community makes the sign of the cross on themselves and receives the peace.



With you and with your Spirit

The priest on the one hand is a human person who represents the community. God has chosen him and anointed him with the Holy Spirit. He has given him divine authority and power. Filled with the Holy Spirit, he greets peace to the community in the name of Christ.

The community responds to the greeting of peace of the priest in the words 'with you and with your spirit'. Now in the Latin Mass too, and also with your spirit is the response of the community. What is the meaning of this response, especially the reference to the Sprit? Through the imposition of the hands of the ordaining bishop, the Holy Spirit has set apart and consecrated the priest for divine services in the Church. May you have the grace to minister in communion with the Holy Spirit in you. This is the meaning of the response of the community. The community prays that the priest may always be in communion with the Holy Spirit (Ep. 4:30). The Holy Spirit he received through the imposition of hands enables him to administer these divine mysteries. This divine power is referred to here as "your Spirit".

3 Adorable Couples in the Bible

The Bible has many heart-warming tales about love and marriage. I have selected 3 of them because of the distinctiveness in the nature of their relationships.

Aquila and Priscilla - The Evangelical Love Story

Aquila and Priscilla were a first century Christian missionary couple described in the New Testament as providing passionate presence and place that strengthened the early Christians. They lived, worked, and travelled with the Apostle Paul, who described them as 'his fellow workers in Christ Jesus and who risked their necks for his life' (Rom 16:3-4). They are often called the most famous couple in the Bible since they are mentioned seven times in the New Testament and are always named as a couple.

Aquila and Priscilla who lived together, worked together and suffered exile together, came to know and love Jesus Christ together, and it made their marriage complete. Their house was a meeting place for the early church. It was always open to people who wanted to learn more about Christ, and for Christians who wanted to grow in the Word.

Although they worked long and hard making and selling tents, maintaining a house and caring for their distinguished guests, they always found time for selfless missionary work. Sharing the Word together strengthened their love for each other and their spirit of togetherness.

Jacob and Rachel

- The Eternal Love Story

This is a story of love at first sight. Jacob first spotted the shepherdess Rachel at a well after arriving in Haran as a young man. Jacob agreed to work for 7 years for her father, Laban, so that he could eventually marry her. That's devotion! Jacob served 7 years for Rachel, and they seemed to him but a few days because of the love he had for her (Gen 29:20). But when the time came, Laban changed his gear and sent a veiled Leah, Rachel's elder sister, to marry Jacob instead. When Jacob learned of the trickery, he agreed to work for Laban another 7 years, and finally married Rachel - what an amazing love story!

Joseph and Mary

- The Daring Love Story

Joseph, the humble carpenter, trusted in God and in Mary enough to marry and travel with her to Bethlehem. Mary was already pregnant via the Holy Spirit. It would be a lot for any man to understand that, but Joseph did so with composure. Mary knew the social rejection and the danger to her life that would result when she accepted God's call to conceive Jesus before she was married. Likewise, though Joseph had the power to save her life by marrying her, he knew that by doing so he also would be socially rejected. In spite of all of these, their love outdid their fear.
