Faith is a term that we all look at with a certain amount of reverence and want to attain in our lives. It means complete trust in God in times of suffering as well as happiness. We often wonder aloud, "Why does God let me go through suffering when I have been devout all my life?

Dear believers in Christ, despite the fact that we are made to attend Sunday classes and study The Bible in detail all through our childhood, Faith Formation still remains as 'rote learning' and not as a true expression of Faith as a Christian. Faith is a tool that should enable us to fight our temptations, resist our personal compulsions that lead us to sin, and help us get through our sufferings with gratitude and thanksgiving.

One thing we must implement in our weekly Sunday class sessions is Faith that is not just 'professed' or 'by hearted', but faith that should be demonstrated with ample examples, experiences and testimonies, so that those who listen to them are more convinced that a God centric approach to life can sustain their



happiness and struggles alike with equal poise.

Home is where the heart is

Just as everything good starts from our home, faith formation too has its base from home and ultimately shapes the course of our religious



beliefs and convictions. Children inherit faith from their parents, through religious practices as well as through observation.

Therefore, it is important for parents to demonstrate their faith to their kids through personal narrations that provide a strong foundation for cementing their belief in the Almighty. Coupled with faith practices that have to be followed religiously, they must aim to create a strong belief system that cannot be shaken in times of trouble.

Being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus. (Philippians 1:6)

I was brought up by a mother who was steadfast in her faith; who believed that attending Sunday class without fail is an integral part of faith formation. 3 pm on Sundays still remain etched in our memories due to the sheer effort she took in taking us for catechism classes.

LEARNING FROM THE HEART

Why does the idiom say 'Learning by heart' and not 'Learning by Head'? When we want someone to study or work hard, we say 'put your heart into it'.

That's why it is necessary to Faith formation to seep into our heart i.e. through activities and actions, making us realize the actual concept, rather than just rote learning for mere exam. Catechism is for the formation of our Faith by disciplined studying and understanding the Word of God, Church history, Liturgy etc. All these should be etched in our heart from the early years of life.

CATECHISM BUILDS CHARACTER

Some may even question the necessity of learning catechism. Isn't just going to Church <u>enough? Why</u> Sunday school?

Ignoring faith formation will be a huge mistake a parent would do as the true knowledge of God must be poured into the young mind of the child for growing up in good Christian character. Catechism helps understand the Word of God, the Sacraments, the Commandments and teachings of Jesus in a systematic manner. In Ephesians 5:10-11, St. Paul urges us "Try to find out what is pleasing to the Lord. Take no part in the unfruitful works of darkness".

PRACTICE MAKES PERFECT

It has been rightly said that children are not passive absorbers of knowledge; rather they are active constructors of concepts. Therefore teachers should include their own experiences or examples from Bible to enhance the learning of the students. Teaching in different modes, multiple formats and in interesting ways will

challenge the children and make it interesting and enjoyable learning.

1 Timothy 4:15 tells us "Put these things to practice, devote yourself to them, so that all may see your progress". Children should be taught to practice what they are learning through the textbooks of catechism, thus forming a habit which ultimately leads to character formation. The students and parents should understand that grades/marks are only short term gains; instead the focus should be on the overall development of a child into a true follower of Jesus.

NURTURING LOVE & FAITH

If we do not build our Faith in Jesus Christ, our life will become meaningless.

St. Paul [1 Corinthians 13:13] has said that 3 things will last forever, Faith, Hope and Love and greatest of these is Love. We know God is Love. When we read the Bible, we understand the love that God has for his people and how He gave his only Son, to redeem us- his people. Students should comprehend and experience this love of God .They should practice this love and share this love with other fellow beings. Only then they can call themselves the true followers of Jesus Christ. We should have thorough Faith in God, otherwise how can one believe that in every Holy Qurbana, it is Jesus we are receiving with our tongue. Without faith, it is impossible to please God [Hebrews 11:6]

Jesus Christ's disciples were mere fishermen who were not even properly educated. In terms of the world they were ordinary people but Jesus what their potential was. Children should stop learning Catechism intellectually for the sake of marks or certificates, instead understand the Word of God and the Teachings of the Church with our heart. Only and only then we can have faith, hope and above it, love for our Church that is the body of Christ.

impression for over 50 yrs. We as Catechists have much more minutes than that ! How many of us understand the gravity of our responsibility?

We have heard of forgiving Jesus.. the forgiving Father in the parable of the Prodigal son.. we must also remember



Mathew 23 : 25 a furious Jesus saying "You Hypocrites ! You clean the outside of the cup and dish, but inside are full of greed and self-indulgence"

Jeremiah 12 : 13 says "They have sown wheat and have reaped thorns; they have tired themselves out but profit nothing. They shall be ashamed of their harvests because of the fierce anger of the Lord."

As a Catechist, we can sow the seeds of Jesus in the fertile minds of our young students and at the same time redeem

ourselves, deepen our faith ourselves and get closer to Jesus with every passing day.

Faith formation of all children begins in the family. Some parents are unaware of their duties as teachers and models of faith within their homes. Some parents seem to think that their role in the faith formation of their children is to take their children to Church for the Sacraments of initiation - Baptism, Communion and Confirmation and relinquish their responsibility to the priest, the religious sister, and the Catechism teachers who instruct their children on basic doctrine.

We need to understand that as parents, we are responsible for the moral and Faith formation of our children. Starting with the Sacrament of Baptism, kids are initiated into the Church with their parents and godparents supporting them as they begin their Faith journey. Parents are the primary teachers (catechists) of the Christian faith for their children. Growing your faith at home doesn't necessarily mean spending hours reading the Bible and meditating. This spiritual growth at home should begin with baby steps, which by the help of parents - the child practices throughout



"Parents have the first responsibility for the education of their children. They bear witness to this responsibility first by creating a home where tenderness, forgiveness, respect, fidelity, and disinterested service are the rule. The home is well suited for education in the virtues. This requires an apprenticeship in self-denial, sound judgment, and selfmastery-the preconditions of all true freedom. Parents should teach their children to subordinate the 'material and instinctual dimensions to interior and spiritual ones.' Parents have a grave responsibility to give good example to their children. By knowing how to acknowledge their own failings to their children, parents will be better able to guide and correct them." (CCC 2223)



their life and passes it to the next generation.

I have been a Catechism teacher since my graduation days, and never have I felt tired teaching the Word of God or sharing my Faith experiences or working for the Ministry of God. Been associated with the Department of Catechism for a period of more than 20 years, I would often think, what made me so attached to this Department of our Diocese? What is so special about this Department?? The reason is my faith in Jesus, our Saviour. Many ups and downs in life! But he has always kept me sailing!! And the reason for this strong faith formation is my 'Parents'. As a child, making me understand the importance of God in our life, the importance of prayer in our life and more importantly, parents being a great rolemodels themselves. The childhood memories of my mother taking me to Church every day for Mass is still afresh! Its not about pushing your children to attend the mass, but more importantly as parents you taking them along, going as a FAMILY! As parents, you being an active participant of all activities in the Church, which is automatically imbibed by our children. Thus, we become part of the Church as A FAMILY! We become part of God! Any act, that you do as a family, shall keep the family bonded together in love. The seeds of Faith formation need to be sowed by a mother right from the womb and eventually grow in faith as a Family.

The essence of our Christian Faith, however, is really a Person: Jesus Christ. It is all about our relationship with him and his Church, which is his mystical body. Christ saves us through him. The experience of being a member of a family which has Jesus as its center - and living this conviction each day - is something every parent can provide, regardless of their level of theological sophistication or learning levels. Just "come and see," as Jesus invites us.

Let us understand and believe that nothing can replace the influence of the example of a parent on the spiritual life of a child.

DO NOT doubt But BELIEVE JESUS

ST. THOMAS first speaks in the Gospel of John. In John 11:16, when Lazarus had recently died, and the apostles do not wish to go back to Judea, Thomas says: "Let us also go, that we may die with him."

John 20:24-29 tells how Thomas was sceptical at first when he heard that Jesus had risen from the dead and appeared to the other apostles, saying, "Except I shall see on His hands the print of the nails, and put my finger into the print of the nails, and thrust my hand into His side, I will not believe." But when Jesus appeared later and invited Thomas to touch His wounds and behold Him, Thomas proclaimed his belief by saying, "My Lord and my God".

According to Syrian Christian tradition, Thomas was killed with a spear at St. Thomas Mount in Chennai on 3 July in AD 72, and his body was interred in Mylapore. Ephrem the Syrian states that the Apostle was killed in India, and that his relics were taken then to Edessa. This is the earliest known record of his death.

The Passing of Mary, adjudged heretical by Pope Gelasius I in 494, was attributed to Joseph of Arimathea. The document states that Thomas was the only witness of the Assumption of Mary into heaven. The other apostles were miraculously transported to Jerusalem to witness her death. Thomas was left in India, but after her first burial, he was transported to her tomb, where he witnessed her bodily assumption into heaven, from which she dropped her girdle.

The hymns of ST. EUPHREM helps us to understand the aim with which ST. THOMAS had come to India as per the plan of the heavenly father, it goes as follows-"It was to a land of dark people he was sent, to clothe them by Baptism in white robes. His grateful dawn dispelled India's painful darkness. It was his mission to espouse India to the One-Begotten. Thomas works miracles in India, and at Edessa Thomas is destined to baptize peoples perverse and steeped in darkness, and that in the land of India."



Let us deepen our faith with the life of ST. THOMAS who obeyed the will of the Father and helped us to know our holy, mighty, immortal GOD.

We have successfully completed two years of online Catechism classes and these two years taught us that 'different' can be exciting, exacting and yet rewarding. It has no doubt added another interesting dimension to the way we Catechism Teachers impart our Faith to the children. The tools that we adopted are here to stay and will undoubtedly enrich our physical classes. While we are all excited and happy about going virtual and digital, for us teachers it will always be 'Work in progress' & 'Learning new ways to keep students interested'. We can use this time before the new academic year kickstarts to reflect on how we can bring a newness to the way we interact, add fresh perspectives to the content and innovate ways of sharing.

It is imperative that we connect with the students well as with every new batch we find the students are sharper and are armed with smarter questions. To begin with we should be ready to 'Unlearn', 'Learn' and then 'Share'. The means adopted to impart Faith should be distinctly different from conventional teaching methods. We should start by questioning ourselves whether we are able to create an interest in the children in the topics that are being discussed or shared. We should realize that today's children are facing multiple challenges and cannot be compared to our times where there were lesser distractions. Children today are living a fast-paced life and are juggling with different pressures. Besides the academic and extra-curricular classes, they, especially the youth, must deal with the peer pressure to be ahead in their knowledge about the latest trends on social media, latest gadgets, contemporary music, trending games etc. Amidst all this it would be imaginably difficult for them to pay attention to a topic which may seem extremely boring. Here is where our connect with them will come into play - when we establish a good connect with the students, we will immediately sense their disinterest and their inability to relate to the subject.

We should try creating an interesting and relatable context and then introduce the topic. Draw parallels to practical situations, more importantly the ones that the current generation can relate to, where it is easier to imagine themselves in. It is also very important for us to know the current threats to our Faith, at a global and national level, the theories that are taking the current generation away from our Faith and how certain sections of the secular world are projecting our Catholic Values. We must be aware of these universal notions that are shaping the personalities and thought processes of our youngsters. We must prepare our students to comfortably face these challenges and hence ensure to give them examples from the real incidents around us. The textual content in the book must be translated to real life scenarios to help them understand that these are not just theories to be learnt by rote and later reproduced for exams but are values that can be practiced to positively evolve their personal and professional life.

Encourage students to ask questions. We will realize that these questions are a way to know ourselves and the students better. We may sometimes be stumped by their questions and may feel the need to research and then answer. Other times these questions provide us insights about the students, their deeper thoughts, aspects that are probably blocking the growth of Faith etc. which will then help us to tweak our method of sharing, bring in added conviction or add more insights.

Some of the other methods to make a class interesting is to make groups and conduct quizzes, skits, debates etc., helping them absorb and own the content in the process. During assessments, encouraging students to write as per their interpretation of the topic, rather than reproducing verbatim from the text is an effective way to assess their understanding of the topic.

"Be on guard. Stand firm in the faith. Be courageous. Be strong" – 1 Corinthians 16:13

All over the world our Faith is facing huge challenges and the children will need to rise in Faith and Grace to overcome them. It is therefore prudent to empower them with a strong foundation of Faith, through a process that is likeable, relatable, convincing, and interesting.

Christ sent forth the apostles he had chosen, commissioning them to proclaim the gospel: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age.

This treasure, received from the apostles, has been faithfully guarded by their successors. All Christ's faithful are called to hand it on from generation to generation, by professing the faith, by living it and by celebrating it in liturgy and prayer. The name catechesis was given to the totality of the Church's efforts to make disciples, to help men believe that Jesus is the Son of God so that believing they might have life in his name, and to educate and instruct them in this life, thus building up the body of Christ.

CCC1693 Christ Jesus always did what was pleasing to the Father, and always lived in perfect communion with him. Likewise Christ's disciples are invited to live in the sight of the Father "who sees in secret," in order to become "perfect as your heavenly Father is perfect."

CCC1698 The first and last point of reference of this catechesis will always be Jesus Christ himself, who is "the way, and the truth, and the life."

The prerequisite for a Catechist is that he/she needs to have Jesus within him/her and only then he/she can give Jesus to the Children.

Catechists need to spend quality personal time with the LORD invoking His abundant mercies and infinite grace. Surrender your students to the foot of the cross and uphold them in your daily prayers . Cling onto Jesus , Hold Onto His promises and follow His Commands, Mathew 28:20 and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.

Interesting Facts about St Thomas



Some more interesting Trivia:

He was a dedicated follower of Christ. When Jesus said He was returning to Judea to visit His sick friend Lazarus, Thomas immediately exhorted the other Apostles to accompany Him on the trip which involved certain danger and possible death because of the mounting hostility of the authorities.

At the Last Supper, when Christ told His disciples that He was going to prepare a place

for them to which they also might come because they knew both the place and the way, Thomas pleaded that they did not understand and received the beautiful assurance that Christ is the Way, the Truth, and the Life.

St. Thomas is best known for his role in verifying the Resurrection of his Master. Thomas' unwillingness to believe that the other Apostles had seen their risen Lord on the first Easter Sunday.

Eight days later, on Christ's second apparition, Thomas even put his fingers in the nail holes and his hand into Christ's side. After verifying the wounds were true, St. Thomas became convinced of the reality of the Resurrection and exclaimed, "My Lord and My God," thus making a public Profession of Faith in the Divinity of Jesus

St. Thomas is also mentioned as being present at another Resurrection appearance of Jesus - at Lake Tiberias, when a miraculous catch of fish occurred.

Tradition says that at the dispersal of the Apostles after Pentecost this saint was sent to evangelize to the Parthians, Medes, and Persians. He ultimately reached India, carrying the Faith to the Malabar coast, which still boasts a large native population calling themselves "Christians of St. Thomas."

Following his death, some of his relics were taken to Edessa while the rest were kept in what is now known as India. They can still be found within the San Thome Basilica in Chennai, Mylapore, India.

The relics taken to Edessa were moved in 1258 to Italy, where they can be found in the Cathedral of St. Thomas the Apostle in Ortona, Italy. However, it is believed that Saint Thomas' skull rests in the Monastery of Saint John the Theologian on the Greek Island Patmos.

In art, Saint Thomas is commonly depicted as a young man holding a scroll, or as a young adult touching the resurrected Christ's wounds.



Saint Thomas was mentioned in several texts, including one document called The Passing of Mary, which claims then-apostle Thomas was the only one to witness the Assumption of Mary into heaven, while the other apostles were transported to Jerusalem to witness her death. While the other apostles were with Mary, Thomas was left in India until after her first burial, when he was transported to her tomb and he saw her bodily assumption into heaven, when her girdle was left behind. Thomas and the girdle were often depicted in medieval and early Renaissance art.

കാർമ്മികന്റെ, വി. കുർബ്ബാന വിശുദ്ധ ജനത്തിനുള്ളതാകുന്നു എന്ന, പ്രാർത്ഥനക്ക് പ്രത്യൂത്തരമായി ഏക പിതാവ് പരിശുദ്ധനാകുന്നു, ഏകപുത്രൻ പരിശുദ്ധനാകുന്നു, ഏക റൂഹാ പരിശുദ്ധനാകുന്നു എന്ന് സമൂഹം ചൊല്ലുന്നു. അങ്ങനെ ദൈവത്തിന്റെ പരിശുദ്ധിയെ പ്രകീർത്തിക്കുന്നു. ദൈവം മാത്രമാണ് പരിശുദ്ധനെന്നും അവിടുത്തെ പരിശുദ്ധിയിൽ പങ്കുചേരുന്ന തോതനുസരിച്ച് നമ്മൾ പരിശുദ്ധരായിത്തീരുന്നു എന്നും ഈ പ്രാർത്ഥന നമ്മെ ഓർമ്മിപ്പിക്കുന്നു. അതുകൊണ്ട് അവിടുത്തെ പരിശുദ്ധിയിൽ പങ്കുചേരാനുളള ക്ഷണമാണിത്. "നിങ്ങൾ പരിശുദ്ധരായിരിക്കുവിൻ, എന്തെന്നാൽ നിങ്ങളുടെ ദൈവവും കർത്താവുമായ ഞാൻ പരിശുദ്ധനാണ്" (ലേവ്യർ 19:2). വി. പത്രോസ് നമ്മെ അനുസ്മരിപ്പിക്കുന്നു : "നിങ്ങളെ വിളിച്ചവൻ പരിശുദ്ധനായിരിക്കുന്നതുപോലെ എല്ലാ പ്രവൃത്തികളിലും നിങ്ങളും പരിശുദ്ധരായിരിക്കുവിൻ" (1 പത്രോ. 1 : 15).

ദൈവത്തിന്റെ പരിശുദ്ധിയിൽ പങ്കുചേരുന്നു

മാമ്മോദീസായിലൂടെയാണ് ദൈവത്തിന്റെ പരിശുദ്ധിയിൽ നമ്മൾ പങ്കുകാരാകുന്നത്. ത്രിത്വെകദൈവത്തിന്റെ നാമത്തിലാണ് നമ്മൾ മാമ്മോദീസ സ്വീകരിച്ചത്. ത്രിത്വൈക ദൈവത്തിന്റെ പരിശുദ്ധിയിലുളള നമ്മുടെ ഭാഗഭാഗിത്തമാണ് നമ്മെ പരിശുദ്ധരാക്കു ന്നതെന്നും വി. കുർബ്ബാന സ്വീകരണത്തിന് നമ്മെ അർഹരാക്കുന്നതെന്നും ഈ പ്രാർത്ഥന നമ്മെ ഓർമ്മിപ്പിക്കുന്നു. അതോടൊപ്പം വി. കുർബ്ബാന സ്വീകരണത്തിലൂടെയാണ് നമ്മൾ ത്രിതൈക ദൈവത്തിന്റെ പരിശുദ്ധിയിൽ പങ്കുകാരാ കുന്നതെന്നും ഇവിടെ നമ്മൾ ഏറ്റുപറയുന്നു.

പ. പിതാവ് ബനഡിക്ട് പതിനാറാമൻ മാർപ്പാപ്പ അനുസ്മരിപ്പിക്കുന്നതുപോലെ വിശുദ്ധി എന്നത് കുറെ സത്പ്രവർത്തികൾ ചെയ്യുന്നതിലൂടെ നമ്മൾ നേടിയെടുക്കുന്നതല്ല, മറിച്ച് എല്ലാ നന്മകളുടേയും വിശുദ്ധിയുടേയും ഉറവിടമായ ദൈവത്തെ സ്വന്തമാക്കുന്നതിലൂടെ നമുക്ക് ലഭിക്കുന്നതാണ്. അതുകൊണ്ട് വി. കുർബ്ബാന സ്വീകരണത്തിനു മുമ്പായി "ഏകപിതാവ് പരിശുദ്ധനാകുന്നു…" എന്നുളള പ്രാർത്ഥന ഈ സത്യം നമ്മെ അനുസ്മരിപ്പിക്കുന്നു. ദൈവത്തെ സ്വന്തമാക്കുന്നതിലൂടെയാണ് നമ്മൾ വിശുദ്ധരായിത്തീരുന്നത്.

അങ്ങിനെ ദൈവത്തിന്റെ പരിശുദ്ധിയിൽ നമ്മെ പങ്കുകാരാക്കി നമ്മെ വിശുദ്ധീകരിക്കുന്ന നിമിഷങ്ങളാണ് വി. കുർബ്ബാന സ്വീകരണത്തിന്റെ സമയം. വി. കുർബ്ബാന സ്വീകരിക്കാൻ ഒരുങ്ങി നില്ക്കുന്നവരെ ദിവ്യരഹസ്യങ്ങളിലേക്ക് ക്ഷണിക്കുന്ന ആഹ്വാനമായിട്ട് 'വി. കുർബ്ബാന വിശുദ്ധജനത്തിനുളളതാകുന്നു' എന്ന ആഹ്വാനത്തേയും അതിന്റെ മറുപടിയായ പ്രാർത്ഥനയേയും മനസ്സിലാക്കാം.

നീ ഭയം ജനിപ്പിക്കുന്നവനാകുന്നു

'ഏകപിതാവ് പരിശുദ്ധനാകുന്നു' എന്ന സമൂഹത്തി ന്റെ പ്രത്യുത്തരത്തിനുശേഷം പ്രധാനപ്പെട്ട തിരുനാളുകളിൽ ചൊല്ലാനായി നല്കപ്പെട്ടിരിക്കുന്ന 'ദ്ഹീലത്ത്' എന്ന പ്രത്യേകഗീതം ഇവിടെ ചൊല്ലുന്നു. ഈ ഗീതത്തിന്റെ സമയത്ത് മദ്ബഹ വിരി ഇടാനും നിർദ്ദേശമുണ്ട്. 'ദ്ഹീലത്ത്' എന്നാൽ 'നീ ഭയം ജനിപ്പിക്കുന്നവനാകുന്നു' (സങ്കീ. 47:2; 68:35) എന്നാണ് അർത്ഥം. നമ്മൾ സ്വീകരിക്കുവാൻ ഒരുങ്ങുന്ന ദിവ്യരഹസ്യങ്ങളുടെ ഔന്നത്യവും രഹസ്യാത്മകതയും ഇതിലൂടെ ഉദ്ഘോഷിക്കു കയാണ്. അതോടൊപ്പം ഭക്തിയാദരങ്ങളോടെ ദിവ്യരഹസ്യങ്ങൾ സ്വീകരിക്കാൻ ഇത് നമ്മെ ഒരുക്കുകയും ചെയ്യുന്നു.

ജീവിക്കുന്ന ദൈവം

തുടർന്ന്, 'ജീവിക്കുന്ന ദൈവത്തെ നിങ്ങൾ പ്രകീർത്തിക്കുവിൻ' എന്ന് ശുശ്രൂഷി ആഹ്വാനം നടത്തുന്നു. നമ്മുടെ ദൈവം സജ്ജീവനും ജീവദായനുമാണ്. അവിടുന്ന് 'ജീവിക്കുന്നവരുടെ ദൈവമാണ്' (മത്താ. 22:32). വി. പത്രോസ് ഈ വിശ്വാസം ഏറ്റുപറഞ്ഞു: "നീ ജീവനുളള ദൈവത്തിന്റെ പുത്രനായ ക്രിസ്തുവാണ്" (മത്താ. 16:16). അതുകൊണ്ട് "എല്ലാ മനുഷ്യരുടേയും, വിശിഷ്യാ വിശ്വാസികളുടേയും രക്ഷകനായ ജീവിക്കുന്ന ദൈവത്തിലാണ് നമ്മൾ പ്രത്യാശയർപ്പിച്ചിരിക്കുന്നത്" (1 തിമോ. 4:10). സജ്ജീവനായ ഈ ദൈവം നമ്മോടു കൂടെയുണ്ട്. വി. കുർബ്ബാന ഒരു സജ്ജീവരഹസ്യമാണ്. അത് കഴിഞ്ഞുപോയ രക്ഷാകരചരിത്രത്തിന്റെ വെറുമൊരനുസ്മരണം മാത്രമല്ല, മറിച്ച് ഈശോയുടെ മരണത്തിന്റേയും ഉത്ഥാനത്തി ന്റേയും രക്ഷണീയസംഭവങ്ങൾ അൾത്താരയിൽ സജ്ജീവമായി സന്നിഹിതമാക്കപ്പെടുകയാണ്.

സജ്ജീവസാന്നിദ്ധ്യം

God alone is Holy

In response to the prayer of the celebrant 'Holy Qurbana is for the holy people' the people say 'God the Father alone is holy, the Son alone is holy, God the Spirit alone is holy'. Thus the community proclaim the holiness of God. This prayer reminds us that really God alone is holy and to the extent we participate in the holiness of God we become holy. Hence this prayer is an invitation to participate in the holiness of God. We read "be holy, for I, Yahweh your God, am holy" (Lev. 10:2). St. Peter reminds us "be holy in all you do since it is the holy one who has called you" (1 Pet. 1:15).

We participate in the Holiness of God

It is through baptism that we participate in the holiness of God. We have been baptized in the name of Holy Trinity. This prayer reminds us that our participation in the holiness of Holy Trinity make us holy and worthy to receive Holy Qurbana. So too we acknowledge that it is through our Holy Communion that we share in

the holiness of God. So the moment of our reception of the Holy Communion is the time of our sanctification through the participation in the life and holiness of God. This proclamation of the celebrant and the response of the community can be understood also as an invitation for those who are prepared, to come and participate in the Holy mysteries.

You Beget Fear

After the response of the community "God the Father alone is holy" there is the special hymn called 'Da Heelath' to be sung by th community on important feast days. According to the rubrics the sanctuary veil is to be closed during this hymn. 'Da Heelath' means you beget fear (Ps. 47:2, 68:35). This hymn proclaims the sublimity and mysterious nature of the Mysteries we receive. So too, it prepares us to receive the divine mysteries with proper fear and devotion.

The Living God

The deacon makes the proclamation saying 'Let us praise the living God'. Our God is the living and life giving God. He is God of the living (Mt. 22:32). St. Peter proclaimed this faith "You are Christ, the Son of the living God" (Mt. 16:16). St. Paul says 'we have put our trust in the living God and he is the saviour of the whole human race but particularly of all believers' (1 Tim. 4:10). This living God is with us in the Church, and the Eucharist is a living mystery. It is not merely a commemoration of a past history. But in the Eucharist the redemptive acts of Jesus' death and resurrection are made a living reality of the present.

The Living Presence

Hence we should always have in mind that Eucharist is a living and life giving mystery. We strongly believe and proclaim our faith that there is a living God present in what we see with our human eyes, as an ordinary bread. We should have deep conviction about Jesus' true and living presence with us in the Eucharist. Here the deacon invites us to praise God who makes us worthy to receive this sublime mystery. Hence we should all have in mind that Eucharist is not an object but the person of Jesus and His living presence. Hence when we speak about Eucharist we should not use merely such terms as 'host' 'bread and wine' but rather 'Sacred Host' or 'Sacred Body and Blood' because Eucharist is God's Living presence.
