## The Bible as the Ultimate Migration Handbook

Migration has been a part of human history since the beginning of time. The Bible is full of stories of migration, both voluntary and forced, and these stories provide insight into how God views the movement of people from one place to another.

In the Old Testament, we see examples of migration beginning with Adam and Eve, who were forced to leave the Garden of Eden after they sinned against God. Later, we see Abraham, who was called by God to leave his homeland and migrate to the land of Canaan. This migration was significant, as it marked the beginning of God's covenant with Abraham and his descendants. God promised to make Abraham's descendants into a great nation, and this promise which began with Abraham, was fulfilled through the migration of the Israelites from Egypt to the Promised Land.

In the book of Acts, we see the early Christians spreading the gospel throughout the world, often through migration. Paul, one of the most influential missionaries in history, traveled extensively throughout the Roman Empire, spreading the gospel and starting churches in new locations.

As Christians, we are called to follow in the footsteps of these early missionaries and to be migrant missionaries ourselves. This means being willing to go wherever God calls us, whether that be to a new country or a new neighborhood. It also means being willing to welcome the stranger and provide for their needs, just as we would do for Jesus himself.

In the modern world, migration is more important than ever. As the world becomes increasingly interconnected, people are moving from one place to another at an unprecedented rate. This movement of people provides both opportunities and challenges for Christians.

# Make Migration a Thought-Through Decision

Today, one of the most significant social trends in the Syro-Malabar community is migration to countries like UK, Australia and Canada. In 2021, Canada admitted a record 405,000 new immigrants. Among them, nearly 100,000 were Indians who have became permanent residents of Canada. At the end of June 2020, 721,050 Indian-born people were living in Australia, more than twice the number in 2010.

This migratory trend is happening at a time when India has leapt past the UK to become the fifth-biggest economy in the world. While many countries like UK, Canada and Australia are talking about a recession or almost stagnant economic growth, the forecasts suggest that India's economy will grow at least by 6- 6.5% in 2023-24. Few months back, 5G services were officially launched in India. Thanks to this, digital commerce, digital health, digital education and the whole digital economy is expected to take off in a big way. The growth in road infrastructure is amazing.

Up to the 80's if many Indians left the country, it was because the state of affairs in the country, during that period was not significant enough . Since then, India has been on the upswing. And all parameters will show that the economic

growth of India is bound to continue for several decades.

Then why are people leaving India in large numbers, at a time when the brand India is clearly on the upswing?

Migration is ultimately a personal decision. Each individual has every right to decide what to do or what not to do with their lives. But it is important that we take a thought-through decision. Here are some points for that introspection.

Today many students are going abroad for their higher studies. 20 lakh Indian students are expected to be studying abroad by 2024. There is no doubt that there are many world class institutions of higher education in countries like US, UK and Canada and it is a dream for many to want to study there.

But how many of our students get admission to these prestigious institutions of learning? 50,000 students were admitted to study in the UK in 2020. Studies show that less than 10% of those students are in educational institutions that have a high position in the world ranking. Are the youngsters of today going abroad for the institution? Or for the permission to stay back in that country after their education? Or to become a citizen in those countries? Do you think you will get a good job in that country, if you pass out of a 'low ranking' educational institution?





Migrating to another country, cutting off your social and family roots and planting oneself in another country is a big decision. While doing it, do not make the mistake of comparing the strength of that country with the weaknesses of India. That is not going to help.

> The recruitment agencies in Kerala will give high promises because it is in their business interest to fill up all the seats in the educational institutions, they have a tie up with, in those foreign countries. Don't go by their word.

Deep Self Research is a must. It is not just about the ranking. Professors, the culture of the university, the place where the university is in and the list goes on. Speak to someone you might know, who has been living in that country for at least 5 years before you decide to spend your hard-earned money on that expensive education.

Many who plan to work in these foreign countries see the potential of the savings they can make. Those savings look big when it is converted into Indian rupees because your local currency multiples almost hundred fold when converted into Indian rupees. But one should remember that to make those savings, one has to live in that country, spend in that country's currency. Does your salary allow you and your family to enjoy at least the basic facilities of that country? Do you want to tighten your belt throughout the year, in that country, just to live like a king for few weeks when you come to India?

In all these developed countries, anything done manually is very expensive. So whether it is painting one's house or cleaning the yard in front of your house, one has to do that job oneself. How comfortable are you in managing all the affairs of the house, all by yourself?

The local population do not have any social connections with the migrant community, beyond the work place. How comfortable are you with that situation? The migrants' social life revolves around mingling with other migrants from Kerala who live in the neighbourhood. But once the kids start going to the local school, they start interacting with kids belonging with other segments of that society. And at great speed adopt the norms of the larger society they live in. How comfortable you are when your kids start picking up the social trends of the country you migrate to?

Migrating to another country, cutting off your social and family roots and planting oneself in another country is a big decision. While doing it, do not make the mistake of comparing the strength of that country with the weaknesses of India. That is not going to help. Instead compare the strengths of that country with the strengths of India and weaknesses of that country with the weaknesses of India.

Just make sure your migration decision is a thought-through decision.

#### Dream Chasersan initiative by Kalyan Diocese

Dream Chasers is a venture initiated by the Diocese of Kalyan in collaboration with Race2IAS a firm based in Eranakulam, to form and orient our children towards a career in administering the country. It aims to help children to dream big and aim high.

Further, to help and guide the children of Kalyan Diocese to decorate the wings of Indian Administrative System as well as various Government services through a long term formation.

We have two streams:

(A) Dream Chasers

Dream Chasers aims at students of 8-12 standards orienting them with regular on line

class (on every Sunday) by experts. Apart from the regular classes on Geography, History, current affairs, Polity etc it also includes motivational classes by IAS/ IPS Officers, child psychologists or and the like experts.

On special occasions like Independence Day, Republic Day etc children are encouraged and motivated to organise activities like debates, speeches or other creative activities which create confidence and initiative in them.

As part of this class students also are given e magazine on current affairs, notes on importance of each day of the year.

(B) Dream Chasers- Gems

Germs project is a newly launched streams aiming only the students of 6 & 7 standards.

It's a unique project in moulding children towards not just government jobs but to actual excellence in life.

How Does it work?

The curriculum has been prepared by experts that help students to appear more than 150 competitive exams in the country

The class is conducted through an app called Testination. Keep 30 minutes daily to watch two videos, get notes and give exam on the class attended. Also notes on current affairs are available in the app.

To evaluate the progress of the student, to encourage and scrutinise paper reading a mentor shall be available to every student. He helps even to appear scholarship and competitive exams including NTSE in the school level.

The efficiency of a student is being evaluated via

Daily exam, Weekly exam and Monthly exam. The same will be updated to the parents.

The parents will have interactive sessions with the Experts from the fields of Civil Service, defence, science, banking etc on monthly basis via a live session called'Gems Talks'.

In short, a child shall be well equipped with confidence as well as intellectual stuff to confront the competitive market ahead by appearing and scoring scholarship examinations from the school level itself. And thus he easily get to the best of the Government jobs and get settled here itself to dream and work for our nation.

#### Civil Service National level model exam

Following the exam pattern of civil service - say, prelims, mains and interview-team race2ias organises a national level model exam every year which brings confidence and experience to students. Since last two years, students from our Diocese also appear for the same and bag prizes and position in the rank list

#### Spark-Residential camp

During the Deepali vacation a residential camp is arranged for students of dream chasers in which work shops, debates, inter active sessions etc are included.

Also students get opportunity to interact with senior civil service officers

#### Conclusion

The plethora of information that I had to learn and understand within the course curriculum is challenging. Nevertheless, the reward is sweet. Educationally speaking, for certain international courses, a CA wouldn't have to write certain papers which is a privilege after getting the CA degree. The job opportunities that open are several. I personally got a job even before the campus placements. A defensive comment that I get if I were to say that 'education overseas doesn't impress me much especially in terms of knowledge gained vis-à-vis the time and money spent' is that the quality of education is significantly better overseas as well as the opportunities. I personally find that to be a weak argument since I have worked (and continue to work) on projects with organizations and individuals internationally and I don't think there is an intellectual bridge to cross to match those standards. This of course is my personal experience as someone working in finance.

It goes without saying that I have come across individuals that are extremely brilliant but those are

exceptional cases, and I wouldn't attribute it solely to the fact that they have studied in a foreign university as I have also interacted with people who have had their whole education in India who have left an impression on me through their intellect. If education is truly better overseas, why would the high-net-worth individuals even consider having their children study in India? Of course, this by no means is a discouragement of pursuing education in world renowned institutions. I do understand the respect one garners if they were from a renowned institution and the job opportunities that become available. However, I would caution students from seeking education overseas just because it is overseas.

Before taking the decision, ask yourselves, will you lead a truly better lifestyle there? Will you be able to afford the same things that are considered normal here like having a cook, a maid, apartment rent that doesn't consume majority of your income, savings, travel expenses, etc.? Seek to improve wherever you are, bloom where you are planted. A degree from India doesn't preclude success. Hard work, determination, courage and lots of prayers is what get you there. I really hope success will be yours!

# Sacred Mysteries received with Faith

In the thanksgiving prayer for the ordinary days, we acknowledge that it is in true faith that we have received these sacred mysteries. We pray that they may 'be unto us for the remission of our debts'. This prayer reminds us that if only we receive the Holy Qurbana with true faith we will receive the fruits of communion. Here in the prayer, Jesus is addressed as "Christ, King of the ages'. Thus an appropriate and lofty salutation is given to Jesus. This prayer reminds us that the world and all ages are under the control of Jesus the Lord and as the supreme King, He governs them for ever.

#### Image of Creator and Servant

Christ is 'the image of both the creator and the servant'. He is the image of the creator; hence St. Paul says: "all things in heaven and on earth, everything visible and everything invisible... all things were created through him and for him" (Col. 1:16). As Son of man he is also the servant. He emptied himself and became like a human being (Phil. 2:7). Here in the prayer, community gives thanks to the Lord, proclaiming the faith that Jesus, because of the merits of His redemptive death on the cross, 'blots out the stains and forgives the debts' of those who receive His body and blood. The community prays ardently for one favour: 'make us worthy to receive you... when you appear in the fullness of glory'. This thanksgiving prayer is mainly a request to the Lord, to make us worthy for eternal reward in heaven.

#### Through the grace of the Holy Spirit

The deacon begins his prayer remembering, in a special way the grace of the Holy Spirit. This prayer reminds us that it is the Holy Spirit who brings us together as a worshiping community and makes us worthy to participate in the divine mysteries. It also reminds us of the blessings received from God by the community.

To approach the Holy Mysteries

The grace that we have received through the Holy Spirit is that we have been made worthy to approach the holy altar and to participate in the divine mysteries. The word Ourbana comes from the Syriac root 'Orev' and it means 'to approach'. We were blessed that we have been made worthy to approach these divine mysteries. On the occasion of teaching about the Eucharist Jesus said: 'No one can come to me unless he is drawn by the Father' (Jn. 6:44). Holy Spirit is the Spirit of God's love. It is by the grace of the Holy Spirit that we were made worthy to approach and participate in these divine mysteries.

#### The giver of all gifts

The mysteries are given four qualification; they are: glorious, holy, life giving and divine. Our participation in these mysteries is fulfilled through the reception of the holy communion. The deacon reminds us to remember these great blessings and to offer thanksgiving to God the giver of these gifts.

#### Ineffable gift

The community responds saying 'we praise you for this ineffable gift'. This term 'ineffable gift' is used by St. Paul referring to the grace of God (2 Cor. 9:15). Holy Eucharist is really God's ineffable gift, for Holy Eucharist is the embodiment of God's boundless love for humankind. Hence 'ineffable gift' is the greatest qualification that can be given to the Holy Eucharist. This word really includes the breadth and the length, the height and the depth of God's love (Ep. 3:18) manifested in this divine mystery.
